Reference the following link <u>prisoner's handbook</u>. Read over it, in general, to get a feel of what rights are guaranteed to prisoners, and what is not allowed.

Next, create a (10 rule minimum) "Bill of rights." Consider the following guiding questions **YOU DO NOT NEED TO ANSWER THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS.** Use them to guide your list.

Guiding questions

What special considerations should political prisoners (where the "victim" is often the state) get, if any?

What special considerations should "heinous" criminals receive, if any?

Should punishment, rehabilitation, confinement, etc., be the primary mode of punishment for criminals? Should "punishment" even be a goal?

How ought a prisoner's' psychological and physical wellbeing be addressed while imprisoned?

What considerations for prisoners who might be incarcerated wrongly should be provided (appeals process, access to law materials...)

How should physical or psychological punishment be used, including the death penalty?
